Summary

Sadly a number of dead plants were found (mainly blackthorn), but many of the plants, particularly dog rose and wild privet, were thriving. A lot remains to be done at the next work party.

In addition, a repair was effected to the damaged gate at the Wheatcroft entrance, some grass was cleared around notices, and some litter was collected.

Some people had to leave at 13.00, and as rain had increased during the morning it was decided to conclude the work party then.
